Richard Waldie



Richard Waldie was born in Liberty Hill, Texas on October 2, 1935 to Richard Lambert Waldie and Alma Exie Bell. He grew up in El Paso and was attending UTEP when he met a chiropractor who inspired him to change career paths. He transferred to Logan chiropractic College in St. Louis, Missouri. After graduation in 1965 he spent the next 40 years helping people of all ages. He truly believed in his calling and had the rare opportunity to do something he loved. And he knew he was helping people every day. His kindness, gentleness, and an unflagging sense of humor brought comfort to many. Richard was a man of endless curiosity and had a variety of hobbies. He loved the water but he just didn't learn to sail. ...he built a sailboat with his own two hands. He enjoyed any activity on water including canoeing, windsurfing, and fishing. Archery was another favorite past time and again He just didn't learn to shoot. . He built his own bows. He was a skilled wood worker and loved the challenge of making beautiful items. He gave most of his works away. He moved to San Saba Texas with his wife Klela in June 2005. He felt an immediate connection with the small community and was moved by how welcoming everyone was. He continued his life long journey of faith at San Saba United Methodist Church. Richard was preceded in death by his parents.
